THE BETH MESSIAH STATEMENT OF FAITH Why we believe Yeshua is the Messiah

1. G-d alone is the source of a satisfying and worthwhile life. Psalm 16:11 Thou dost show me the path of life; in thy presence there is fullness of joy, in thy right hand are pleasures for evermore.

2. There is a barrier between G-d and us. Isaiah 59:1 Behold, the L-rd's hand is not shortened, that it cannot save, or his ear dull, that it cannot hear; 2 but your iniquities have made a separation between you and your G-d, and your sins have hid his face from you so that he does not hear.

3. Our good deeds won't remove the barrier. Isaiah 64:6 We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a polluted garment. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away.

4. G-d has provided atonement as a way of removing the barrier, and atonement requires blood. Leviticus 17:11 For the life of the flesh is in the blood; and I have given it for you upon the altar to make atonement for your souls; for it is the blood that makes atonement, by reason of the life.

5. Isaiah identifies the Messiah as the one who will be the ultimate sacrifice and thus end the Temple's Sacrificial system. Isaiah 53:4 Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by G-d and afflicted. 5 But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that made us whole and with his stripes we are healed.

6. At least 48 specific prophecies further identify the Messiah, all of which have been fulfilled in Yeshua of Nazareth.

7. G-d has provided atonement via Yeshua to remove the barrier to Him. John 1:12 But to all who received him, believed in his name, he gave power to become children of G-d, even to those who believe in his name.

From the Rabbi



The Sidra for this week is called **Ekev (as a result)** and the Scriptures are **Deuteronomy 7:12-11:25, Isaiah 49:14-51:3 and Hebrews 11:8-13.**

The word ekev can be literally translated as "heel." Midrashically, one could think of this verse in a different way.

Deuteronomy 7:12: *If you pay attention (literally, as a result [ekev] of paying attention) to these laws and are careful to follow them, then the LORD your God will keep his covenant of love with you, as he swore to your forefathers.*

Or we can see the portion teaching that we should pay attention with our heels, that is with the desire to act on our listening. It is not enough to listen. We must learn to follow through.

Isaiah recounts sadly that Israel has not hearkened and will suffer exile. Yet, she shall return. Faith and works will again be consistent in Godliness.

The Hebrews portion likewise encourages us of the body of Messiah to live in a manner consistent with our faith. All in all, this is a huge challenge. To bring Faith and Works into sync.
